Our Commissioners have now confirmed by letter their cable to us concerning the above soldier. They advise that L/Corporal Perry who was admitted to the Bath War Hospital on the 11th October last, suffering from shrapnel wounds in the right thigh, was transferred to Dartford on the 5th November last, being discharged to furlough and had to report at Hurdcott, Salisbury, on the 7th November last.
